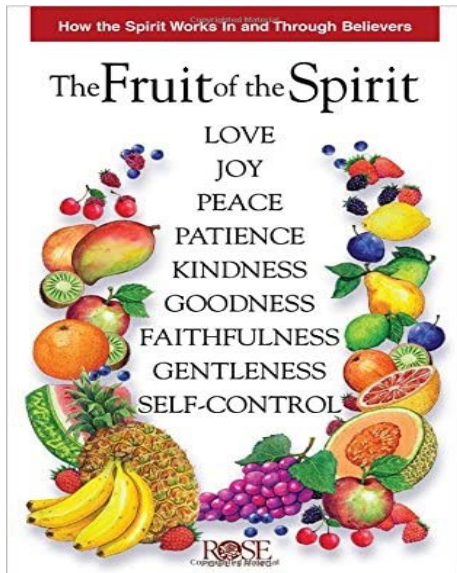

CAN YOU LOVE AS GOD DOES?



"But the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." Galatians 5:22-23. "These three remain, faith, hope and love but the greatest of these is love." 1 Corinthians 13:13

In his d365 devotion on August 7, Tim Tate wrote and I paraphrase: "If you don't have nice things to say, don't say anything at all. When we as children are taught this phrase, it may sound simple.
