FROM THE PASTOR

Well we're off! So much for January 2020. If rain is an indicator of God's blessings in our life, watch out! I think we officially had a "toad strangler" of a month, and hope the rains continue, perhaps just not as intense.

Of course, February is Super Bowl time. The teams have played hard and earned their positions as AFC and NFC Champions, but now they must face each other, compete at the highest levels and with the advertisers as well. A thirty second ad will set one back 5.6 million this year and the competition for one's attention during time outs, breaks and injuries will be as fierce off the field as on.

What would you be willing to pay to get someone's attention?

I think about the costly nature of advertising, the risk versus the return, the planning, the energy and effort to move from concept, to story board, to paid ad is enormous. The expense required to become a household name is staggering.

However, at the end of the ad, he is abruptly awakened by a co-worker who is administering the Heimlich maneuver, forcing the young man to expel a cashew nut that was stuck in his throat. Did I go buy one of these cars? No, they start at \$61,000.00, but presumably many people did go and buy one, the company is still in business and still asking over \$60,000.00 for these cars. Nonetheless, it is a more important date for us than even the Super Bowl, because this date marks for us the beginning of a journey that ultimately ends at The Cross. February 26th, Ash Wednesday signals for us a time of preparation, a journey of fasting, a turning of our hearts to God. It is also a reminder of the costly nature of the event, and the lengths God will go to attract our interest and save our souls.



This February do watch the game, if that sort of thing interests you. Do watch the ads and pick a favorite, Lord knows they paid a fortune to be the best. However, don't let February be merely about a super game, but rather focus more on the Super God, who has paid the highest cost imaginable to get our attention. Perhaps a slogan to keep in mind along our Lenten journey might be: You can't get to Easter without Good Friday.
