We entered another Lenten season on Feb. 26. How can you make this time of reflection different from others? Some folks give up something meaningful to them. Is giving something up all that is needed or does it need to be replaced with something such as prayer, Bible study, fasting, serving? Should whatever we do be as individuals, as a church or both?

For this year I am suggesting two approaches to enriching our personal spiritual lives and our witness as a congregation. One is to conduct a sin inventory. Some of the things on mine would be: not showing God's love toward those, shall we say, who are not my favorite people; not controlling my tongue or gossiping; making judgmental statements; and not recognizing the opportunities God gives me to witness each day. And the list goes on and on. Obviously these are things I need to give up and not just for Lent. My plan is to select the ones from my sin inventory with which I have the most trouble and concentrate, a week at a time, on giving them up and replacing with a good deed. Add correcting a new sin each week. It goes without saying, I cannot do this alone. With God's help and your prayers, I will succeed.

The second approach is continuing to develop an attitude of gratitude. Make a gratitude journal. Once again, each week of Lent, make a list of things for which you are grateful and thank God for them. You may also want to send folks on your list a note, text or call.

In his article, GRACE, GRATITUDE and FAITH, Jeff Bjorck wrote: "love and God's grace are what will get you through" each day. He was writing as a caregiver for his Mom who had Alzheimer's disease but his suggestions can be helpful to all of us no matter what the circumstances. His first point was Grow Gratitude or no matter what thank God. Look for even a small kernel of goodness in every situation which could just be learning a tough lesson or relying on God to get us thru a hard time. Research tells us of the positive psychological effects of gratitude so each day view life as a gift from God and find something for which to be thankful. 2. Make a lot out of a little. No matter what you have or don't have, you can always put the "scraps together to make a quilt" and if you have a lot, then help others make a quilt. 3. Stay involved. Who in your family or church family could benefit from some involvement from you....a card, a meal? A phone call, a visit, an offer for transportation, etc.? Now do it. And lastly, Have faith. Know what you believe and why. Jesus became one of us and lives with us. The whole world is a testament to God's presence. Whatever we are going thru, look at it as a phase in God's working and be grateful. Gratefully, Spread your faith in your world.




