


We mark this celebration by receiving the Pentecost Offering in support of church-wide ministries which nurture the faith of those who are the church to come: children, youth, and young adults.

Are we a praying church?

How many answered, yes, and how many, no? First, let's all stop and spend a moment in silent prayer, praying for our church and the church universal.

Isaiah 24-27 tells us that God is working, even behind the scenes, in all our lives. If we listen and get out of His way he will give us the courage to do what He has given us the ability to do. One of the things we all have the ability to do is pray. Other Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 and Matthew 21:13


What is prayer? One definition is prayer is a conversation, a conversation implies talking but also listening. Another is prayer is a general word for ALL communication with God.

"The Praying Church" by Dr. Richard J Krejcis talks about why churches have successful ministries. He and many others, including Jim Cymbala in "Fresh Wind, Fresh Fire," maintain that prayer as a primary church focus is the key to doing God's will. They are not talking about just praying in worship, meetings and activities, which are crucial, but they maintain that we should be operating within an organized prayer base.

Do we have an organized prayer operating base? Is our church really a praying church? Yes, we pray during worship meetings. Yes, we have prayers in meetings and activities. Yes, intercessors, prayer chains and our congregational care list. We, as a church, do a really good job of praying for and taking care of our congregation.

As necessary as all the above mentioned prayers are, do they make us a praying church? Not if you use the definition of operating from a prayer base. Where is our specific set aside time for corporate prayer? Do we meet to pray for worship, for spiritual leaders, for staff, for our music program, for our Sunday school and teachers, for our children and children's programs, for our youth and youth programs, for our adults, for our more life experienced members, for missions and evangelism, for revival, for the church universal, for our congregation, for our community, for our leaders, local-national, for families, for schools, for law enforcement? Do we have a specific time and people set aside for these prayers? One of our intercessory groups was designed to pray for our church, for our members as a worshipping body, for our staff and for our officers. This started in the sanctuary and had ten or so members. Now we have four.

Please don't get me wrong. I appreciate what we are doing and all those involved but I think we are responsible to do more. Some form of prayer is mentioned in the Bible 375 times. Jesus was continually in prayer, alone, in public, before meals, before important decisions, before and after healing and for help doing the Father's will. In the four gospels, Jesus talked about the importance of prayer at least 12 times while demonstrating His need for prayer and there are 38 scriptural references to his praying. It has been said, Prayer is not preparation for the great work. It is the great work.
