



CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



What is JOY for a Christian?

Happiness or Joy?

Many people have a goal to be happy. It is much easier to be happy when everything is going the way we want and we have no major problems. Happiness seems to be based upon "happenings." If things are going well, we are happy but when trouble or disruptions come, what happens to happiness? It is probably gone but with trust in Jesus, we still have God's joy. We can have God given joy without being happy but can we really be happy without God's joy?

One definition of joy is "the great emotion of great delight or happiness that is caused by something exceptionally good or satisfying." This type of joy is earthly and can be fleeting but for Christians the joy that God gives us is eternal. There are over 214 Biblical passages about joy. The Bible never promises us happiness but does promise us joy. As stated earlier, happiness may be temporary and based upon what is happening. Joy is from the Lord and we can experience God given joy even when we may be experiencing trials, suffering or testing. Joy from God is permanent. It is one of the fruits of the Spirit (Gal 5:22). Spiritually, we experience joy from God's goodness. It is a deep God inspired feel-

ing. It gives us peace and brings about rejoicing. We rejoice in Him because His salvation is for us (Psalm 40:16, 64:10). God promises us joy and He keeps His promises. "The joy of the Lord is my strength" Neh. 8:10.

Psalm 126:3 "The Lord has done great things for us and we are filled with joy." Joy is a condition of the heart and is from within, regardless of what is happening around us. Joyful people are full of gratitude. The Greek word for joy describes a feeling of inner gladness which leads to a cheerful heart leading to cheerful behavior. And certainly helps us live a life full of joy and promise regardless of what is happening around us. Biblically speaking, "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning." (Psalm 30:5) One of my favorite joy verses is Psalm 28:7. "The Lord is my strength and my shield: my heart trusts in Him and He helps me. My heart leaps for joy and with my song I praise Him."

My answer is yes there is a difference in happiness and joy. The first may be fleeting but the joy from God is permanent. Praise God for His joy. I joyfully thank Him for each of you.

Challenge: Remember God's joy is not circumstantial. Accept it with gratitude. Go in God's love and be overjoyed.

Prayer: Help us all feel the joy that only comes from You; and all God's children said...Amen.


