

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION TRADITIONS

What are traditions? According to Wikipedia and theologically speaking, Tradition with a capital T "is understood as the fullness of divine truth proclaimed in the scriptures." One source said there are 100 Biblical references to tradition while another claimed 51. Listed first in both is 2 Thessalonians 2:15, ESV, "So, then brother, stand firm and hold onto the traditions you were taught by us..." and 1 Corinthians 11:2 ESV, "Now I commend you for remembering me in everything and maintain the traditions even as I deliver them to you." Jesus told us to love, to go and to do and He gave us Baptism and The Lord's Supper while demonstrating the need for prayer and worshiping together as a body of believers. Commandments or Traditions? Does the terminology matter as long as we obey?

Now as to traditions with a small "t." These are ideas or beliefs passed down from one generation to another or "any activity you purposefully repeat together that strengthens the bond, offers comfort and security and teaches values." These are positive traditions but sometimes traditions become ineffective and don't work as hoped. We all have traditions in our lives, some so engrained that we don't even think about them much less evaluate them to see if change is needed.

What are the traditions of our church? Obviously, the ones listed above that start with a capital T but what about our small t traditions? Some have more meaning for some of us than others. How many FPC traditions can you name? Some are: Worship at 11:00 on Sunday, hanging Lenten curtains, Chrismon trees in our sanctuary during Advent and all our choirs. These are definitely positive and meeting the needs for which they were designed and passed down. Now, is Sunday School at 10:00 on Sunday meeting the needs of all our congregation? For those attending, the answer is yes.

However, is there a different time, a different day or organization that will better meet the needs of more of our congregation? What other traditions may need changing?

All of you know by now that we have a mission study team to help us look at ourselves as a church. Are we open to looking at ourselves and responding accordingly? If change is indicated in some areas, are we amenable? Please respond to their request to complete the questionnaire which will be dispersed on September 8. You have a voice in the outcome so please express your opinions and ideas about current and future "traditions." Let's look forward to this with joy! Remember, change can be positive.

**PRAYER:** Father, we are asking for you guidance for our mission study team and for us. We pray that You will guide us into strengthening what we are doing that is working, help us change what needs changing, and add what we need to strengthen our witness for You.
