AUDIO/VIDEO VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!










Craft An Easter Cross

"Before they call I will answer: while they are still speaking I will hear." Isaiah 62:24

The Bible tells us that God made everything and knows everything. He isn't simply aware of events in our lives. He is compassionate and He knows how these events affect us. He understands that "little things" can seem like big things depending on our age, past wounds, resources, etc. We pray, not always getting the answer we want when we want or think we need it. Looking back later we see God's plan and know His plan is always better.

"Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails." Proverbs 19:21

The Bible has many stories of interrupted plans. One is Paul. When on his second missionary journey, Paul planned to go one way but God sent him another direction. In a dream one night, God let Paul know that Macedonia needed him more than where Paul originally planned to go. Turns out this is when Paul planted the first church in Europe. How many other Biblical characters can you name that had the same experience? When have you had a similar experience?

Yes, it is sensible to make plans. We have heard, "Fail to plan and you plan to fail." But God has plans and may disrupt our plans with His own. Our challenge and responsibility is to listen and obey, knowing we can trust God completely. When we submit to His will, we will find ourselves fitting into His purpose for our lives. Looking back, we can see why God changed our plans. He had a bigger plan for us.

So, as we continue to make plans, let's add a new twist: Plan to listen. Plan to listen to God's plan.

The questions are: How can we submit our plans to God as we begin each day? And how can you listen to His Plan?

God already knows what's going on in your life. He is waiting for you to ask for His help.


