

RESOLUTIONS



"A firm decision to do or not to do something" is one definition. Another is "the act of finding an answer or solution to a conflict, problem, etc." Did you make any New Year's resolutions? Or did you decide, well, I probably won't be able to keep them so no need?

Last month, I challenged you to think about where you want to be spiritually when Advent 2022 comes and what you need to do to get there. There are some concrete measurable things we can do to aid this process of spiritual growth on our faith journey.

- 1. I will have a set aside time for daily devotions and prayer and another time for family devotions.
- 2. I will attend and participate in worship service at least 45 (or pick a number) times in 2022.
- 3. I will attend and participate in Sunday School at least 45 (or pick a number) times in 2022.
- 4. I will participate in a Bible study in addition to Sunday School.

These all help with our devotion/learning part of our faith journey. And for the witness part of the journey some suggestions are:

- 5. I will say the blessing at every meal and have at least x (pick a number) family meals a week.
- 6. I will write/text/call one of our shut-ins at least once a month.
- 7. I will use the gifts and talents God gave me and volunteer at church and/or another organization.
- 8. I will be a witness in my every day and work life by not participating in un-Christian behavior and be an encourager not a discourager or gossip.

These are a few measurable resolutions and will certainly help our faith journey. Are you thinking, where will I

find the time? One commandment is keep the Sabbath holy. If we try to do all of these things, it will not take an entire day. So we will still "owe" God some time. After all, He is with us all the time so can we not give Him some of our time in addition to number 8 above?

Even trying to reach our goals is a step in God's direction. A closer, deeper relationship with God is the ultimate goal for Christians. Relationship is a head and heart thing. How do we measure the heart/emotion part? Maybe by: leaving our troubles with Him, trusting in His timing, and having faith in the assurance that we are His; by automatically saying thank you when we receive blessings and answers to prayer, by seeing all the God-winks in our lives, by recognizing Providence and not coincidence, and by acknowledging the empty spaces in our heart can only be filled by God. He alone provides abundant life full of meaning found in Him.

As humans, we fail sometimes miserably. However, remember, "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail, THEY ARE NEW EVERY MORNING; great is your faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22-23.

We can't change yesterday or live in the future. We have now and can strive to live the now for Jesus who constantly gives us what we need to obey Him, grace and mercy.
