

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION FAITH IN GOD AND HAPPY THANKSGIVING




"The one who calls you is faithful and He will do it" 1 Thessalonians 5:24 and verse 18 "give thanks in everything for this is God's will for you."

What is faith? I read one definition that actually made me a little angry/upset. It said faith is a "strong belief in God or in the doctrines of a religion, based on spiritual appreciation rather than proof." It is incredible to me, how anyone can look around and not see "proof." A much better definition is, "complete trust and the confidence in someone or something." Faith certainly includes thought, reflection and leads to action. To me faith is the complete assurance and confidence that God created the world including me, He loves me, died and rose for me to have eternal life. What is your definition?

God's faithful love for us is manifested in Jesus coming to earth and Jesus certainly had faith when He died on the cross. Hebrews 11 defines faith as "the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" and goes on with "by faith" and gives examples of people who had faith in God. By faith Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Sarah and tells what that enabled them to do. What words would you use to add your name to the list? By faith-----add your name and explanation.

In many instances it is easier said than done when someone says to you, "just have faith." Opinions of faith may vary but most can agree that our faith in God is reflected by the way we live our lives and is demonstrated in what we say, do and how we behave. Faith is a gift from God that gives us a way of life.

Faith practices express what we hold valuable and truthful. It is life-giving and has a way of bringing to the surface our deepest hopes, for we know our God is THE God of hope, is merciful and just. His mercies are



new every morning. Remember "faith without works is dead" (James 2:26) and "faith can move mountains" 1 Cor. 13:2b.

Faith includes gratitude. How can we not be thankful? Research shows that thankful people are happier, more optimistic and even have fewer health issues than people who dwell on daily hassles. It is safe to say being thankful and giving thanks has a way of changing our lives. And the Bible instructs us to do so. Some verses are Psalm 100:5; Psalm 107: 8, 15, 21, and 31. And Paul in his letter to the Philippians linked thankful prayers to the peace of God. (4:7). Focusing on God and his goodness helps us to have less anxiety. Giving thanks guards our hearts and minds and changes the way we look at life. "A heart of gratitude nurtures a spirit of joy."

Challenge: With faith and thanksgiving welcome our next minister, Rev. Clark Remsburg and his family. Join together in showing them FPCO hospitality. Be open to where and how God is using Rev. Remsburg to lead us.

Lord of life and love, strengthen my faith when I am weak.

Help me to practice faithful living day by day.

Heal me of my brokenness and make me whole in you.

For by faith and with faith, I can do all things through you.

In Jesus' merciful name I pray, amen.
