



# CHRISTIAN EDUCATION UNITY IN FAITH



It has been said that faith in Christ is a communal experience and not just an individual one. When the New Testament talks about believers it is almost always plural (Ephesians 2:17-22). These verses use plurals and strongly suggest the church is a community, a shared experience with one another. The belief that believers are a community is mentioned at least 25 times in the NT. We also have guides on how we are to relate to one another as "community." Romans 12:10, 16 says be devoted to each other in brotherly love, honor others above self, live in harmony and do not be proud, nor conceited and learn to live with everyone. Romans 15:7 tells us to accept each other as Christ accepted us. In Ephesians 4:2; 32, 5: 21 and in other Biblical passages we see how we should relate as believers. One thing is sure. Abraham Lincoln said a house divided cannot stand, implying a house undivided can stand. As believers, we are to be a house undivided in our stand for Christ. No matter our differences and worldly things that may divide us, Paul tells us (Eph. 4:3) "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit..." God alone can give us the wisdom and strength to keep unity with one another through the help of the Holy Spirit. Thus we can be a light in a dark, divided world. With unity in faith we can reach/serve our faith family and also others. We will become a sanctuary for all.

When David described unity in Psalm 133, he likened it to the fragrance of oil and the dew on the mountains. Oil fragrance can fill a room and dew can bring life and blessings. V.3 Unity in faith can have pleasant side effects such as welcoming each other and those who are alone, being flexible with others and being humble. Let's be united as a body of faithful believers so that God can bring about good through us!

Lastly but most importantly, to be more capable to walk in unity with each other, we must first focus on seeking unity with God. We must submit our wills to His. We must strive to be more like Him. Being one with God means we will be more complete through our unity with others.

**CHALLENGE:** Every day take a quiet moment and reflect on where God is guiding you. Then decide what your part of "faith in unity" is and take action. Balance unity with God with unity with others.

**PRAYER:** God, help us focus on You and not the chaos of the world. Help us stand as beacons of your love and recognize those standing with us. Help us see more similarities than differences and be humble and nonjudgmental. May we always welcome everyone with love and compassion as we strive to be united in faith.

JESUS, transform MY HEART.


